

G6 – Map Skills - Emoji Symbol Mapping Our School



You are going to use some familiar symbols to map out your own school. You can find a full list of them by clicking on the following link. <http://getemoji.com/>

Emojis represent emotions as well as being a good way to show where physical objects are. Look at the plan of the school site and try to attribute 20 emojis to places around the school.

The website above lists all the emojis in different categories. Click on the title of each section to be taken to a full list and then on the symbol that you want. Now you can copy and paste the images onto the table below. But

..... the rule is that you are only allowed to use People Emojis. No animals, nature, sport, travel, objects or symbols.

Make a list of the 20 places in and around the school building that you could apply an emotion or symbol to. Try to get a good spread around the school including places you are not so familiar with.

The Final Display – Emoji Mapping Our School Day

Task 1. You are now ready to put together your emoji map of our school. To do this please follow the instructions below:

1. Print out Page 2 in colour on a sheet of A4
2. Print out Page 3 in colour / b&w on a sheet of A3
3. Print out Page 4 in colour / b&w on a sheet of A4

Task 2. You will be given a sheet of A2 card. You should stick your A3 map of the sheet in the centre with the key in the bottom right hand corner.

Task 3. You should now cut out all the photos on Page 4 and place them around the display with a ruler drawn arrow pointing from the photo to where on the map they were taken and your chosen emoji.

Task 4. You are now going to ‘emotion map out’ a typical day in your week in school. Choose any day (not Wednesday) and work out which rooms / facilities you would be in using the table below.

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Task 5. Using graph paper, or Excel, create a line graph to show your emotions at each of these ten places. You are responding to the physical space where you are rather than the subject that you are learning. How does the environment make you feel and why? The table below shows your five categories of emotion and you will need to cut them all out and stick on the Y axis of your graph to represent your feelings.

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Your line graph should have 10 points to plot (see timings of day above) as against 5 different emotions.

Task 6 – Print out your graph and stick it to your display.
