| Features of the artwork. | - The outline of Mount Vesuvius in the background with Pompeii in the foreground. <br> - The volcano has been drawn to look like a mountain and not a volcano. <br> - The volcano might be erupting and there could be smoke, dust and fire. <br> - You might try to draw a pyroclastic flow, but it is not clear what it is. <br> - There might be a lack of buildings or people on the drawing. | - A good attempt at drawing the scene of the eruption, although parts of the diagram may be unclear. <br> - You have tried to show how the eruption looked including dust, fire, and lava. <br> - You can clearly see Mount Vesuvius and the shape resembles a stratovolcano. <br> - The city of Pompeii is visible, and the destruction is quite easy to interpret. <br> - You might have tried to draw people, who look scared. They might look like 'stick people'. | - A very clear diagram showing the impact of the eruption on Vesuvius and on Pompeii. <br> - Pyroclastic flow is visible. <br> - Destruction of Pompeii is clear. <br> - Burning buildings and collapsed buildings. <br> - Ash falling and thick layers on the ground <br> - Perhaps outlines of victims under the ash (later to be found in the 1870's). <br> - People trying to escape, either running away or in boats. |
| Use of colour \& mood of the artwork | - Inappropriate use of colour that is not suitable for a diagram from this time <br> - The artwork doesn't represent what the eyewitness account says. | - Tries to use darker colours to represent the darkness created by the ash clouds. <br> - Has researched examples of artworks of this event using Google Images. | - Excellent use of colours to illustrate the mood of the artwork. <br> - Dark colours mixed with bright colours to show fire, explosions. <br> - Pencil work / paint is used to very good effect. |
